“Changing Inequalities and Access to a Differentiated Higher Education System”

This seminar will present the findings of the research project on *Changing Transitions to a Differentiated Higher Education System*, funded by the Nuffield Foundation. The project has been carried out by Dr Linda Croxford and Professor David Raffe at the Centre for Educational Sociology, University of Edinburgh, from 2011-2013. It has analysed Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS) data on applications and entry to full-time undergraduate for selected years from 1996 to 2010, in order to:

- map the changing social, demographic and educational characteristics of applicants and entrants to HE,
- analyse the changing nature of institutional differentiation, and
- analyse differences across the four home countries of the UK, and changes in cross-border flows of applicants and entrants, in the first decade since devolution.
